<sup>3</sup>Grace, mercy, and peace will be with us from God the Father and from Jesus Christ, the Father's Son, in truth and love.

<sup>4</sup>I was overjoyed to find some of your children walking in the truth, just as we have been commanded by the Father. <sup>5</sup>But now, dear lady, I ask you, not as though I were writing you a new commandment, but one we have had from the beginning, let us love one another. <sup>6</sup>And this is love, that we walk according to his commandments; this is the commandment just as you have heard it from the beginning — you must walk in it.

<sup>7</sup>Many deceivers have gone out into the world, those who do not confess that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh; any such person is the deceiver and the antichrist! <sup>8</sup>Be on your guard, so that you do not lose what we have worked for, but may receive a full reward. <sup>9</sup>Everyone who does not abide in the teaching of Christ, but goes beyond it, does not have God; whoever abides in the teaching has both the Father and the Son. <sup>10</sup>Do not receive into the house or welcome anyone who comes to you and does not bring this teaching; <sup>11</sup>for to welcome is to participate in the evil deeds of such a person.

<sup>12</sup>Although I have much to write to you, I would rather not use paper and ink; instead I hope to come to you and talk with you face to face, so that our joy may be complete.

<sup>13</sup>The children of your elect sister send you their greetings.

<sup>12</sup>After this he appeared in another form to two of them, as they were walking into the country. <sup>13</sup>And they went back and told the rest, but they did not believe them.

<sup>14</sup>Later he appeared to the eleven themselves as they were sitting at the table; and he upbraided them for their lack of faith and stubbornness, because they had not believed those who saw him after he had risen. <sup>15</sup>And he said to them, "Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation. <sup>16</sup>The one who believes and is baptized will be saved; but the one who does not believe will be condemned. <sup>17</sup>And these signs will accompany those who believe: by using my name they will cast out demons; they will speak in new tongues; <sup>18</sup>they will pick up snakes in their hands, and if they drink any deadly thing, it will not hurt them; they will lay their hands on the sick, and they will recover."

### NICENE CREED

With the whole church, let us confess our faith.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, **G** so that he might come to have first place in everything. In Christ all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell; Through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things;

Reconciling all things whether on earth or in heaven, **(B)** by making peace through the blood of his cross. Alleluia.

Blessed are you, O God of the universe. . . . With this bread and cup we remember our Lord's passover from death to life as we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

O God of resurrection and new life . . . Grace our table with your presence.

Reveal yourself to us in the breaking of the bread. ... Send us forth, burning with justice, peace, and love.

## Come, Holy Spirit.

With your holy ones of all times and places . . . we praise you, O God, blessed and holy Trinity, now and forever. **Amen.** 

## LORD'S PRAYER

Lord, remember us in your kingdom and teach us to pray. Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

Worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness; **G** let the whole earth tremble before him.

Let the heavens rejoice, and let the earth be glad; G let the sea thunder and all that is in it; let the field be joyful and all that is therein.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, **G** as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.
