PANDEMIC PROTOCOLS

Jesus said, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (Jn. 13:34-35). And the Apostle Paul reminds us that love "does not insist on its own way" (1 Cor. 13:5).



Please know that the Congregation Council will continue to review our pandemic protocols regularly and adjust them as necessary. The following protocols are in effect at this time:

- Wearing a mask during worship is optional at this time.
- There are three tiers of seating safety: (1) The pews on the main floor of the nave are open for family groups. Please consider your physical distance. (2) The back two rows of seating on each side (4 family groups) are marked and reserved for those wearing masks and needing more distance from others to feel safe. (3) Upstairs balcony seating (front side) is available for masked non-singers.
- Members are reminded to maintain some physical distance when visiting with one another, especially before and after worship service.
- The Wednesday Holy Communion Service is always a spoken service and is the safest.

We do things like get vaccinated, wear face coverings, maintain physical distance, and curtail our singing for the sake of one another. While these actions may be inconvenient or uncomfortable, we seek to live out our love for our neighbor, in faithful obedience to our Lord, Jesus Christ.

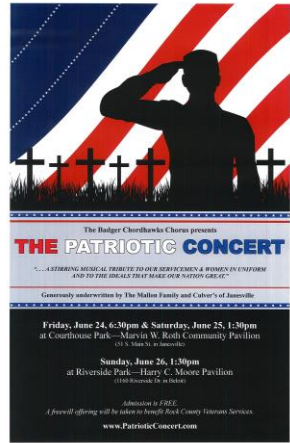

TURTLE CREEK CHAMBER ORCHESTRA COMES TO ST JOHN LUTHERAN CHURCH!

The Turtle Creek Chamber Orchestra will perform in the Sanctuary of St John Lutheran Church on July 17, 2022 at 3:00 pm. The orchestra is led by their conductor, Dr. J. Ian Nie. Dr. Nie is a classically trained pianist who has performed in

Europe, China, and the USA. They are a small string orchestra that focuses on performing during the summer, and providing music education to under-privileged young people in the area. Their performances feature music ranging from classical masters to jazz to string arrangements of popular music, such as Adele or the musical *Wicked*. We often spotlight local students, composers and musicians as guest artists.

Their youth programs include the Nie Young Artist Scholarship Competition for students of bowed-string instruments and piano, held in January each year. In July each year, they offer a Youth Summer String Camp for five days. Area children studying string instruments are invited to participate, and provided the opportunity to study and perform with members of the orchestra, as well as a featured guest clinician.

This will be an outdoor concert held in their beautiful new amphitheater.

This concert will be part of their wonderful Musica Maxima series.
