ASH WEDNESDAY AND LENTEN SCHEDULE

Ash Wednesday will be on February 22nd this year. Ash Wednesday Services with Communion and Imposition of Ashes will be held at 11:00 am and again at 6:30 pm. Weekly Lenten Services with Communion will be held on every Wednesday during Lent at 11:00 am and a second Evening Prayer Service (not a Communion Service) will be held at 6:30 pm. There

is a long tradition among Lutherans of dedicating more time for worship during Lent, usually by attendance at a mid-week worship service. This year Lenten Mid-week services will be offered on February 22, March 1, 8, 15, 22, and 29. The 1:30 p.m. service will be our usual spoken Holy Communion. The 7:00 p.m. service will be based on Evening Prayer from the *Lutheran Book of Worship*. We hope that you will join us in this special time of preparation for Easter.
