

Rock County ADRC is making vouchers available to Seniors in Rock County. The vouchers are worth \$35 per person and may be used to purchase fresh produce from local farmers. Who is eligible?



- Rock County Residents age 60 or older (Native Americans age 55 or older).
- Monthly household income which does not exceed \$2249 for a one-person
- household , or \$3041 for a two-person household.
- Each eligible individual may receive vouchers only once in 2023.

The voucher distribution for Janesville will take place on Tuesday, June 20th at the Rock County Resource Center at 1717 Center Ave., Janesville from 2-3:30 pm.
